Welcome to Rockhampton Bowls Club. Come and enjoy a friendly game of bowls in our undercover facility. We play day or night, rain, hail or shine.



The past several weeks have been so busy that it could have been easy to lose sight of the purpose of our Club to our Community. Our Committee Members, both Management and Bowling, however, realise the importance of our Bowls Club and our responsibility to our Members and the Rockhampton area community. This past week saw Member, Moyna Richardson, selling raffle tickets in support of the Cancer Fund's Biggest Morning Tea Fund Raiser. Bowlers had a selection of prizes to choose from and Members were generous in their support. This activity is just one example of our commitment to community.

COMMUNITY FACILITY

Of course, the basic purpose of our Club is to provide the venue and opportunity for people of all ages and abilities to learn to play, enjoy and compete in lawn bowls, in a safe and welcoming environment. Examples include providing a safe environment for the Access Recreation folk to enjoy some bowling and Moyna Richardson's school groups and potential State contestant's, honing their bowling skills. Members, however, over time, have also made the venue a place for the Rockhampton Community to meet and enjoy social functions and other activities and so the importance of maintenance and renewal of the venue is ongoing.

HELP TO PARTICIPATE

These aids are to allow our members who are having difficulty with physical disablement to trial at RBC and to determine the aid to suit them personally. We hope to acquire two Bowls Australia approved Wheelie Walkers in the near future. This will broaden the options for players. VOLUNTEERS A NECESSITY

It is to the credit of all those who volunteer their time, labour and expertise that Rockhampton Bowls Club has managed to continue with all its functions while maintenance work has continued. It is also a credit to those engaged in carrying out the maintenance work, that they have worked cooperatively, around the Club activities as much as possible. Our RBC, June Card Day was well attended and an enjoyable afternoon for ladies and gents with players playing a wide selection of games and sharing a delicious afternoon tea, despite organiser Kay Borg nursing a broken arm. This Grant of \$2,000.00 will allow the Club to purchase equipment and provide some benefits such as a bowls and breakfast morning or other appropriate encouragement rewards for our Volunteers.

DELIVERING Cost of living relief



The Coalition Government is helping households deal with cost of living pressures.

Cutting fuel excise in half which will save a household with two cars who fill up once a week around \$30 a week or around \$700 over the next six months.

From 1 July, over 10 million individuals will receive a one-off cost of living bonus of \$420.

A one-off, tax exempt cost of living payment of \$250 for 6 million pensioners, welfare recipients, veterans, and eligible concessioncard holders in April 2022.
